History:

Started in December 2009 in Nairobi
Young people across East African countries.

Registered in Kenya since August 2010
As an international youth led non-profit organization.

Registered in Rwanda since March 2018
As an INGO after an invitation by the government to replicate "a water kiosk at school" to help improve quality and learning outcomes across primary and secondary education in the country.

Registered in USA since March 2022
As a 501 (c)(3) Nonprofit organization with 2-fold mission based in Houston.

Impact:

As of December 2023, ITF Projects are directly providing livelihood to over 219,000 people.
This includes over 122,400 people who have access to clean water in their communities
and over 8,900 school children who no longer must absent themselves from school to secure water for their families.

- Empowering American young people through educational, cultural and or social volunteering opportunities.

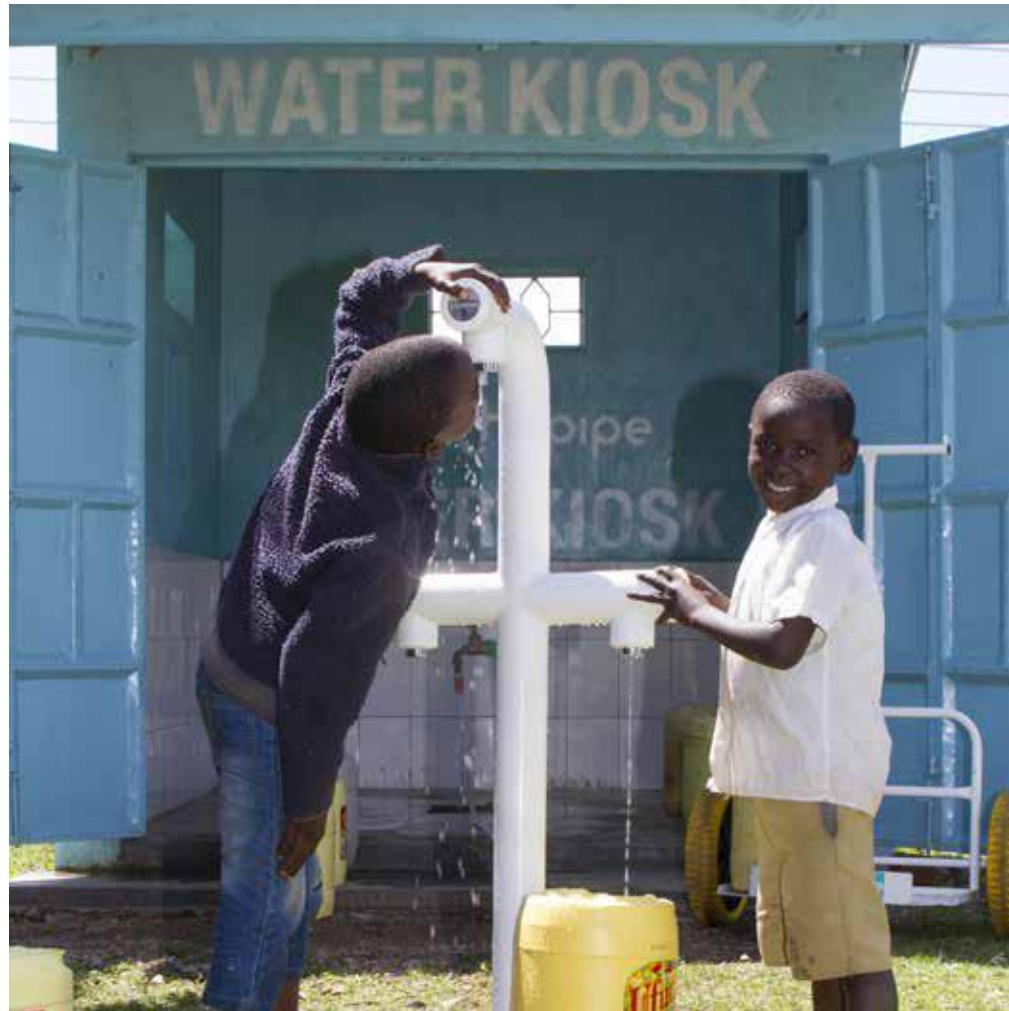


How:

After raising needed funds in the USA, we send American people to Africa to partner with local counterparts to set up:

- Water kiosk at schools in rural & urban (informal) communities.
- Public drinking tap water Fountains in urban communities.

Thus, providing American people, a unique educational experience while providing host community clean water!



A Water Kiosk at School: The Problem We Are Solving



- In Africa only about 1/3 of the population has access to clean water close to their homes at an affordable price.

- School going children walk at least 6 km to secure water for their families before/ after going to school. Resulting in school drop out.

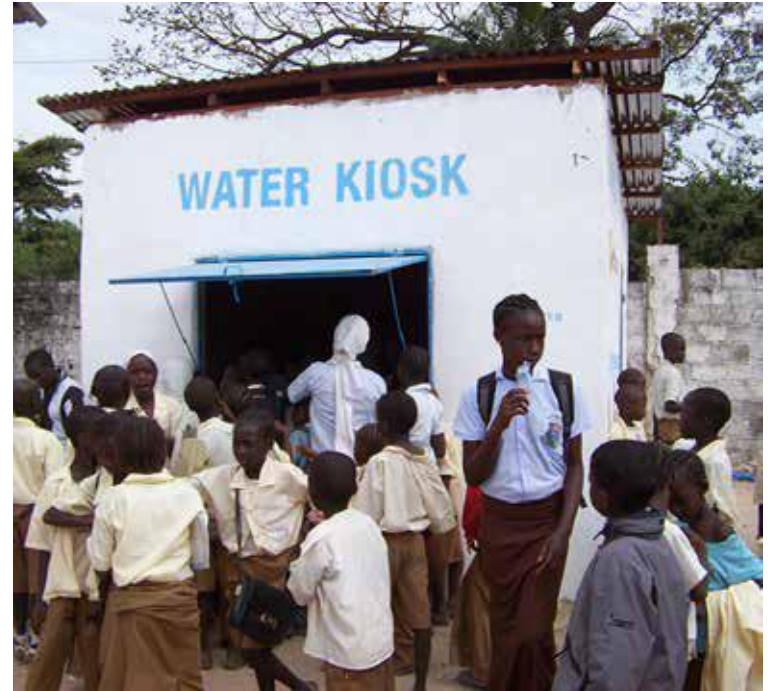
A Water Kiosk at School: The Solution



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Consists of:

- Financing schools in communities with no tap water system, to set up onsite water kiosk for the students to transport clean water from school to their homes.
- Students-managed business selling clean water to community residents at an affordable price.
- Educational & profitable business teaching the students business and entrepreneurial skills. And generating income for the school.
- Providing everybody in the community with clean water.

Public Drinking Water Fountain: The Problem

- Most governments in Africa have banned single-use plastic, but plastic waste remains a major challenge.
- The chief contributor is the lack of clean drinking water.
- The only source of clean drinking water is single-use plastic bottled water for those who can afford.



Public Drinking Water Fountain: The Solution



Install sustainable outdoor tap water Fountains nearby:

- Sports arena
- City centers
- Market place
- Parks
- Bus stations...

For people to:

- ✓ access clean drinking tap water free of charge.
- ✓ Reduce plastic waste.
